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Summary of Questions/Comments	Responses
Was the meeting presentation posted online prior to the meeting?	Meeting presentation materials will be posted after the meeting. Draft presentation can be posted online prior to the meeting, if available.
How will vehicular ingress/egress be handled?	Vehicular ingress/egress is currently being analyzed both in terms of existing conditions, as well as planned future growth on campus and in the immediate vicinity. Further information will be shared during the second community meeting.
How will the proposed Project accommodate students getting to/from campus using electric bicycles/scooters/skateboards?	As part of the scope of this proposed Project, street and sidewalk improvements to enhance circulation and safety will be made within the proposed Project boundaries, and along W. Linden Street and Canyon Crest Drive. UCR has ongoing pathway improvement projects that would help with the pedestrian circulation on campus.
Lighting concerns as it relates to proper shielding, glare, brightness, dark sky, and height of lighting fixtures.	With a few exceptions, existing campus policy requires that riders dismount in the core campus. The proposed exterior lighting for the proposed Project would be for safety and security purposes and would be designed to prevent light spillage
	onto adjacent properties. In compliance with the requirements of the 2021 Long Range Development Plan, the proposed Project would be designed to be consistent with the Campus Construction and Design Standards and would be subject to a campus design review process, including lighting design.



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What is being envisioned in the recreational area?	The recreational area will be general spaces to support a variety of recreational activities.
Is there enough parking for the proposed Project?	Yes.
Incorporation of trees.	Trees and appropriate landscaping will be included as part of the proposed Project. There will also be a Central Park that includes the existing mature trees that is a part of the proposed Project.
